



# THE FREE FRIDAY PATTERN

Yarn: Julia by Borgo de' Pazzi Firenze

URBAN CHESTNUT by

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#### MATERIALS:

- 5 coconut shell buttons (1,5mm diameter)
- 350gr of Julia yarn by Borgo de' Pazzi for the S size or 450gr for the L size
- 6,5mm hook
- wool needle and scissors.

#### ABBREVIATIONS:

- CH: chain
- SLST: slip stitch
- STS: stitches
- ST: stitch
- SC: single crochet
- HDC: half double crochet
- DC: double crochet
- BS: bubble stitch
- BPDC: back post double crochet
- FPDC: front post double crochet
- SK: skip





## PATTERN:

This cowl come in two size. The high is the same for both, only change the number of repetition in the lenght.

You must crochet a rectangle, refill the edges and then sew the buttons.

This pattern is written in US standard therns.

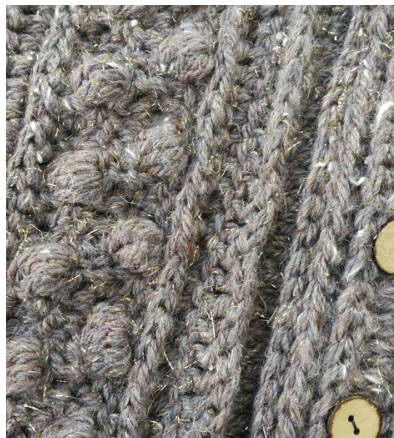


CH 40

R1: SC in the 2nd CH from the hook, work 38 SC in the next STS. Turn the work.

R2\_4:CH2, work 38 HDC in the next STS. Turn the work.

You must sew the 5 coconut buttons between the R3 and R4, evenly spaced.



R5: CH3, work 38 DC in the next STS. Turn the work.  
R6: CH3, work 38 BPDC. Turn the work.  
R7: CH3, work 38 DC in the next STS. Turn the work.  
R8: CH3, work 38 BPDC in the next STS. Turn the work.  
R9: CH2, 2HDC in the next STS, 1BS in the next ST. \* 3 HDC in the next STS, 1 BS in the next ST \*repeat from \* to \* 8 times, work 3 HDC in the next STS. Turn the work.  
R10: CH3, work 38 DC in the next STS. Turn the work.  
R11: CH2, 4 HDC in the next STS, 1BS in the next ST. \* 3 HDC in the next STS, 1 BS in the next ST \*repeat from \* to \* 7 times, work 5 HDC in the next STS. Turn the work.  
R12: CH2, work 38 HDC in the next STS. Turn the work.  
R13: CH3, work 38 FPDC. Turn the work.  
R14: CH3, work 38 DC in the next STS. Turn the work.  
R15: CH3, work 38 FPDC. Turn the work.  
R16: CH3, \* SK1, CH1, 1 DC in the next ST \* repeat from \* to \* until the end. Turn the works.  
R17: CH3, work 38 DC in the next STS. Turn the work.  
R18: CH3, \* work 1 BPDC, 1 FPDC in the next ST \* repeat from \* to \* until the end.  
R19: CH3, \* work 1 FPDC, 1 BPDC in the next ST \* repeat from \* to \* until the end. Turn the work.  
R20: CH3, \* SK1, CH1, 1 DC in the next ST \* repeat from \* to \* until the end. Turn the work.

Repeat from R5 to R20 two times for the small size or three times for the large size.

At the end of the rounds repetitions, add the space for the buttons hole.

R21: CH3, work 38 DC in the next STS. Turn the work.  
R22: CH3, work 38 BPDC. Turn the work.  
R23: CH3, work 38 FPDC. Turn the work.  
R24: CH3, work 38 DC in the next STS. Turn the work.

Here you can insert your buttons to close your cowl. You can easily use the DC side spaces as holes, no sophisticated stitches is needed.

R25: CH3, work 38 FPDC. Turn the work.  
R26: CH3, work 38 BPDC. Turn the work.

At this point of the work you should finish the long sides with a cute edging. The pattern is the same for both sizes. Work identically on both sides.

Start edging with the right side of the hood facing you.

R27: CH3, work 2 DC in each DC side and 1 DC in each HDC side evenly spaced. Turn the work.  
R28: CH3, work 38 BPDC. Turn the work.  
R29: CH3, work 38 FPDC. Turn the work.

*Weave in all the ends and enjoy this cozy cowl!*
