GLITCH BY BORGO DE' PAZZI

GLITCH BAG

*The bag is worked in rounds. Do not turn your work at the end of each Row .
Do not close the rounds. Unless it's mentioned in the description.
Place a stitch marker in the first stitch of the row.*

MATERIAL:

- YARN: Borgo de' Pazzi, Glitch (90% cotton - 10% polyester, 250 gr/185 mt, 3 cones 250 gr (tot 750 gr), col 77
- Hooksize 9 mm / M/13
- Stitch marker

GAUGE:

9 stitches x 7 row in half double crochet with a 9 mm hook measures 4 x 4 inch.

Stitches used (US terms)

ch = chain

hdc = half double crochet



INSTRUCTIONS:

Start with 16 chain stitches.

Row 1

Hdc in the 2nd stitch from the hook. Place a stitch marker in the first stitch.

13 hdc.

3 hdc in the next chain stitch.

13 hdc.

2 hdc in the last chain stitch. (32)

Row 2

2 hdc in the 1st stitch.

13 hdc.

2 hdc in the next 3 stitches.

13 hdc.

2 hdc in the last 2 stitches. (38)

Row 3

2 hdc in the 1st stitch.

14 hdc.

(2 hdc in the next stitch, 1 hdc) 2 times. 2 hdc in the next stitch.

14 hdc.

(2 hdc in the next stitch, 1 hdc) 2 times. (44)

Row 4

2 hdc in the 1st stitch. 2 hdc in the next stitch.

15 hdc.

(2 hdc in the next stitch, 1 hdc) 2 times. 2 hdc in the next stitch.

15 hdc.

2 hdc in the next stitch. 2 hdc. 2 hdc in the last stitch. (50)

Row 5

1 hdc in the 1st stitch. 2 hdc in the next stitch.

16 hdc.

(2 hdc in the next stitch, 3 hdc) 2 times. 2 hdc in the next stitch.

16 hdc.

2 hdc in the next stitch. 3 hdc. 2 hdc in the next stitch. 2 hdc. (56)

Row 6

4 hdc. 2 hdc in the next stitch.

17 hdc.

(2 hdc in the next stitch. 4 hdc) 2 times. 2 hdc in the next stitch.

17 hdc.

2 hdc in the next stitch. 4 hdc. 2 hdc in the last stitch.

The bottom of the bag is now approx. 30 cm wide.



Row 7 to 12

1 hdc in each stitch.

Row 13

Remove the hook from the stitch.

Put the hook from the back side into the next stitch.



Pull the loop around the hook.



Pull the loop through the stitch to the back.



Pull the thread tight. Ch 1.

1 hdc in the 3rd loop of each stitch. This is the loop behind the little V of the stitch.



Row 14 and 15

Repeat row 13.

Row 16 to 18

1 hdc in each stitch.

Row 19 to 21

Repeat row 13 to 15.

Row 22 to 26

1 hdc in each stitch.

Row 27

Pull the loop from the front to the back through the first stitch (as described at row 13).

Ch 1. 16 hdc in the 3rd loop of the stitch (the loop behind the little V of the stitch).

Ch 27. Skip 11 stitches.

20 hdc in the 3rd loop of the stitch.

Ch 27. Skip 11 stitches.

4 hdc in the 3rd loop of the stitch. (94)

Row 28 and 29

Repeat row 13.

Fasten off. Sew in any loose ends.
